Protect the civil rights of low-income individuals and people of color by providing immediate access to free legal support in case of an arrest.

ORGANIZATION OVERVIEW

Good Call seeks to reduce mass incarceration and empower communities that are marginalized by the criminal justice system. Good Call does this by ensuring that people who get arrested have a fair process and just outcome, and that they aren't punished because of how much money they have, what they look like, or where they live. Good Call runs a free, tech-enabled 24/7 hotline to connect people with immediate legal help if they, or a loved one, are arrested. The long-term goal is to reduce pretrial jail nationwide and support policy that requires better legal support throughout the arrest process.

Prior to founding Good Call, Gabe managed physical and digital products at a 3D printing tech start-up in New York City.
